Where Do Mayor and Council Candidates Stand on Protecting Trees and Parks?

Tree Canopy NOLA, the Mid-City Neighborhood Organization, and Parks for All sent a questionnaire to all Mayor and Council candidates in August 2025. We compiled responses that will help everyone cast an informed vote in the October 11 and November 15 elections. We expect these candidates to be accountable for following through on their commitments when some are elected to lead city government for the next four years.

<u>Summary</u>: We received overwhelmingly positive responses showing strong support for protection of trees and expansion of parks among New Orleans' next elected leaders. Except for one candidate who "Did Not Answer" Question 2, every other candidate said "Yes" to Questions 1, 2, 3, and 5. Two candidates said "No" to Question 4, and two candidates "Did Not Answer" Questions 6 and 7. Every other candidate said "Yes" to Questions 4, 6, and 7. We did not request comments, but if a candidate who completed the questionnaire submitted a narrative reply, we've presented it after the questions.

<u>Voter Expectations</u>: Based on the responses we received, here's what voters should expect from their next Mayor and City Councilmembers:

Greater Transparency from Parks & Parkways, including advance notice of work on major trees (Q #1)

More Powerful Penalties for violations of tree protection ordinances (Q # 2: A-E)

City Budget Funding to prepare a Comprehensive Tree Management Plan (Q #3)

Landmark Tree Protection on public and private property (Q #4)

No Net Loss of Green Space as assured by New Orleans' Master Plan (Q #5)

Support for The Big Green Easy—and **Funding** to implement the plan (Q #6)

Coordination Among Department Heads to protect trees (Q #7)

These much-needed improvements stand in stark contrast to current conditions. From greater transparency at Parks & Parkways to cooperation among department heads—our trees need all the help they can get. New Orleans has lost more than 40% of its tree canopy in the last 20 years. Members of the tree advocacy community should vote to elect leaders who will stand with us in protecting trees and parks.

The Questionnaire Process Explained:

On August 5, Tree Canopy NOLA, the Mid-City Neighborhood Organization, and Parks for All distributed a questionnaire among all Mayor and Council candidates, requesting responses by August 22.

On August 20, we distributed a "friendly reminder" to all candidates who had not yet responded, noting that the August 22 submission date was only two days away and that the summary of candidates' views would say "DID NOT RESPOND" if we did not receive their completed questionnaire.

On Monday, August 25, we sent a "Last Call for Tree Protection Survey Responses" to *candidates who had still not responded*, noting that we would prepare and distribute a final summary after Labor Day, which was just one week away.

This Summary of Candidates' Views on Protecting Trees and Parks includes responses from all candidates who completed the questionnaire and identifies candidates who DID NOT RESPOND. Although we did not solicit extra comments, some candidates chose to submit them, which we have presented in this Summary of Candidates' Views.

The following candidates DID NOT RESPOND to our first, second, or third requests for them to fill out and return the questionnaire: **Mayor**—Butler, Collins, Scurlock; **District A**—Neal; and **District E**—Burbank, Christmas.
